Steven won Second Prize in the 2021 Monday Musical Club Scholarship Competition, as well as the 2021 Bellagrande Piano Competition. He was a winner in the 2019 Washington State Music Teachers Association (WSMTA) Playoff Competition for Clark County. As a winner, he had the honor of performing at the District IV Honors Recital in Centralia, as well as at the WSMTA State Conference at the University of Puget Sound's Schneebeck Hall. Furthermore, Steven won Second Prizes in the 2019 WSMTA Outstanding Artist Competition, as well as the 2019 Oregon Federation of Music Clubs Suzanne Raines Young Artist Competition, and was also the Alternate winner in the 2019 Oregon Music Teachers National Association Junior Piano Competition. Steven also played for the residents at the Bedford Senior Living community during the holiday season.

Outside of piano, Steven enjoys designing, constructing, and flying model and high-power rockets as the leader of the Camas Rocketry Club. He is also interested in research on the human mind.
